Lector

Lectors are trained to read one of the lessons during church services. They might also lead the psalm and intercessions.

Lay Readers

The lay readers are licensed by the bishop to lead morning or evening prayer. Additionally Lay Readers are trained in the reading of lessons, leading the prayers of the people, and the administration of the chalice.

Eucharistic Minister/visitor

Assist the priest in the distribution of Communion and take Communion to the sick and homebound at the end of the service.

Acolytes

Acolytes or servers are children, youth and adults who perform a number of tasks during the service. They light the altar candles before and after the service. They carry the cross, Gospel Book and candles in procession. And they assist the priest during the service.

Altar Guild

The alar guild works in teams to prepare the church for services and clean up afterwards. The flower guild arranges flowers for Sundays and principle feast days.

Choir

It is said that those who sing pray twice. The choir assists the congregation in singing hymns and sings anthems, psalms and other songs for our worship services. You do not need to be a trained singer—just love to sing.

Ushers

Ushers assist the congregation on Sunday and on Holy Days by providing hospitality and assistance to those who attend or visit the church for services. This is one of the easiest and most rewarding ministries. Training is available for families or individuals. The ushers greet and assist the members of the congregation, collect the offerings, help to keep the services orderly, and return the church to good form following each service.
